May 23 – June 8

A Walk in the Woods – by Lee Blessing, Drama, Rated PG.

The place is a “pleasant woods on the outskirts of Geneva,” where two superpower arms negotiators, a Russian and an American, meet informally after long, frustrating hours at the bargaining table.

June 13 - July 6

Steel Magnolias – by Robert Harling, Comedy/Drama, PG.

The action is set in Truvy's beauty salon in Chinquapin, Louisiana, where all the ladies “who are anybody” come to have their hair done. Originally a play which met with immediate critical and popular acceptance in its premier production, it later became a major motion picture with Julia Roberts and Dolly Parton.

July 11 - August 3

What the Butler Saw – by Joe Orton, Farce, PG-13.

The Prentices are not an ordinary couple. Dr. Prentice is a psychiatrist with his own hospital who believes the best way to interview a girl for a job is to seduce her. Geraldine does her best to comply, but nothing is going to work smoothly in this nut house that includes Mrs. Prentice, a nymphomaniac who is seduced by a bellhop in a hotel, or maybe it's vice versa.

August 9 - August 31

The Taffetas – by Rick Lewis and Arthur Whitelaw, Musical, “A Musical Journey Through the Fabulous Fifties,” G.

Kaye, Peggy, Donna, and Cheryl are four sisters from Muncie, Indiana, whose singing group they've named The Taffetas (after the material of their dresses). The show is filled with songs of the

fifties: “Mr. Sandman,” “Mockin' Bird Hill,” “Sh-Boom,” “Tonight You Belong to Me,” “I'm Sorry,” “Music, Music, Music,” “Where the Boys Are,” “Sincerely,” and many, many others from an era of wonderful music.

September 6 - September 22

Romantic Fools – by Rich Orloff, Vaudeville-style Comedy, PG-13.

Man and Woman are oddball singles who meet on a blind date and move through various stages of a burgeoning relationship toward marriage. Rich Orloff, author of *Domestic Tranquility* and *Shedding Light*, which have both been staged at Shadowland, brings us a look at the War Between the Sexes that premiered at the prestigious Key West Theatre Festival in Florida.
