At the Elementary Festival, my daughter played the recorder. My son played the alto sax in the Instrumental Festival. My niece sang in the Choral Festival. There were many other students from Ellenville who also performed with style. Our music faculty, which includes my sister, was integral to the success of this event.

Our neighbor school, Rondout Valley SD, was extremely well represented by both their students and faculty. We have much to be proud of with both these schools' programs representing all and parts of the Town of Wawarsing. The musicians were not only talented, but also demonstrated maturity beyond their years.

Music is just part of what these students are learning. These musicians learn time management. They must juggle their time to include schoolwork, music practice, other school interests and, of course, their friends. Such organizational skills are best learned at an early age. It is not too early for my fourth-grade daughter to be introduced to this idea.

These young people also experience the importance of working together. In sports, it is called teamwork. In music, the various sections of the group must perform their parts well for the entire group to accomplish their task... a great performance.

Interacting with others and interpersonal skills are other valuable experiences learned by our students. Rehearsal time was limited. For these concerts to be as good as they were, the interactions between the musicians were important for success.

When you think about what these young people learn from music festivals, you realize why these events are so important. Time management, hard work, dedication, the ability to work with others and interpersonal skills are all attributes of a strong leader. Our leaders of tomorrow must be developed and encouraged today. Leadership is not an accident; it is not genetic; and it must be taught. While the home is where children encounter their first leaders, the schools are the natural place for the qualities of leadership to be reinforced.

If you are curious about who tomorrow's leaders will be, attend your local school's concerts, ballgames, spaghetti suppers, and dramatic performances. You don't even have to be a parent to appreciate the efforts.
