Mrs. Bowler moved to Ellenville over 50 years ago to raise her two children. Her daughter, Joyce Smith, resides with her husband Ray in Cragmoor. Her son, Bruce Bowler, and his wife Ann live in the village of Ellenville. Surviving are her four grandchildren and their spouses, four great grandchildren, a sister, a brother, and two nephews.


The club will again participate in the *Fourth of July Parade*. June Clark is the chairperson for this event and the float will be done with red, white, and blue flowers.
