Berkshire Art Motorcoach Trip

The *Hunt Memorial Preservation Committee* presents the Clark Art Institute, the Williams Inn, & MASS MoCA, as part of a "Gourmet Art Tour," **Wednesday, Oct. 8th**.

Don't miss this glorious trip to the Berkshires during peak fall foliage to see two of the finest museums in the Northeast! We leave at **7:45 AM** from the lot just north of **Canal Street** (across from the *Village Motel*) on **Rte. 209** in Ellenville and we return at approximately 7:30 PM. The fee of **\$95** includes the luxury motorcoach, breakfast en route, a private tour of The Clark Art Institute in Williamstown, Mass., wonderful lunch at the Williams Inn, a private tour of MASS MoCA, North Adams, Mass., all gratuities, and box dinner with cold beverages on the return trip.

The Sterling and Francine Clark Art Institute is one of the most beloved and respected art museums in the world. The Clark is renowned for its collection of French Impressionist paintings by Monet, Degas, Pissarro, and especially Renoir. The color and light filled "Renoir Room" is extraordinary. The Clark is also known for its collection of 19th century American paintings as well as English and American silver. After the tour there will be time to visit the Museum Shop before a special lunch just minutes away at The Williams Inn.


After lunch is another wonderful museum visit. In 1999, in the quaint town of North Adams, a museum called MASS MoCA opened its doors. A group of curators were looking for mill space to exhibit large works of contemporary art that would not fit conventional galleries. If you have not yet visited this museum, you are in for a treat! Robert Wilson's "14 Stations" combines architecture, sculpture, sound and light to create an immersive environment. Another exhibit called "Yankee Remix" is collaboration with the Society for the Preservation of New England Antiquities, involving the work of nine artists. Following the tour, there will be time on your own to see the rest of the museum or sit in the café. Our box dinner will be prepared by Lickety Split, one of MASS MoCA's restaurants.

Lecture on Ukraine Famine

The *Ellenville Public Library & Museum* will host a lecture by Oksana Bakum, former Lecturer of 19th century Russian and Soviet Russian Literature at SUNY New Paltz, entitled "Ukraine 1932-33 Revisited," on **Tuesday, October 14th, 7:00 PM** in the **Community Room, 40 Center Street**.

The purpose of the address is to provide insight into the famine in Ukraine during the winter and spring of 1932-33, its historical causes and the tragic result of a mass genocide, and cover-up by the Soviet regime.

The sponsor of the lecture is the Ukrainian National Women's League of America, created in New York in 1925 by Ukrainian women immigrants. This type of association began in Ukraine following World War I in the western part of the country that had not fallen under the Soviet occupation, but was dominated at that time by the Polish Republic. At the time of the famine in Ukraine, the League made numerous attempts to aid the victims, but all aid was rejected by the Soviet regime.

The UNWLA became incorporated in 1935 and 1979 as a non-profit organization, pursuing charitable, humanitarian, educational and cultural activities. Since 1953 it has been a member of the National Council of Women of the USA, which enabled it to participate in the World Conferences on Women's Issues, under the aegis of the United Nations. The League founded The Ukrainian Museum in New York City, an authoritative resource on Ukrainian history, culture and art.

The lecture is free and open to the public, and the **Community Room** is fully accessible to the handicapped. For information, please call **647-5530**.
