TOP SHELF JEWELRY

For that hard-to-shop-for teenaged girl (hold for Dec. 8-13 sale). This wholesaler manufactures reproduction antique jewelry, and holds retail sales four times a year. Ms. Hoff explained you'll see five local artisans selling their work as well as her jewelry. Their discounts are great! The general pricing rule there is half-wholesale. The jewelry sells retail in upscale boutiques and museum catalogues, so a piece listing for \$80 in the Philadelphia Museum of Art catalogue will cost about \$20 here. An excellent sale for kids and the frugal shopper, as well as those appreciating the quality of a one-of-a-kind piece. Everything from a \$1 trinket to a beautiful \$200 hand-made shadowbox.

ELLENVILLE PUBLIC LIBRARY

For a childhood friend, now living upstate, a Christmas ornament of her childhood church. *The Pride Committee*, to celebrate our Bicentennial in 2006, is holding this sale as a fundraiser. This year's collection (The *Shiloh Baptist Church*, *Cragmoor Chapel of the Holy Name*, *Napanoch Reformed Church*, and her long-gone *St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church*) will culminate in 2006 with a total of 16 local houses of worship represented. The *Library* is selling the ornaments as a courtesy to the *Committee* and has a number available at this writing, or can refer you to the *Committee* for more information. (Incidentally, the *Library* itself sells historical works by local authors, and the adjoining *Museum* reproduction postcards (circa 1940s-'50s is my guess) of area hotels, tourist sites, and landmark buildings. A packet of these three-for-a-dollar cards tied with a satin ribbon makes a great hostess gift for Hanukah, Christmas, or New Year's Eve. Keep in mind, if invited to a Kwanzaa celebration, that gifts are not expected nor encouraged. If you want to make a small token gift for the kiddies, it should educate, and reflect the values of this secular holiday.

ACE HARDWARE

Two silicone baking pans (muffin tin and bundt cake) @ \$15. These are neat foldable and dishwasher safe silicone molds, generally used in professional kitchens. Hard to find both online and locally, but available at the higher price of \$15/18 online. I could match the price at a large chain, but they were out of stock and not expected soon. *Ace* also stocks a number of old-fashioned kitchen tools: I found a \$2 Ecko potato peeler right next to the fancy \$50 Cuisinart toaster, which was next to the \$12 toaster by Black and Decker.

For the craft lady, 100 5x7" card-stock blank cards and matching envelopes, ivory watercolor-type finish, \$17 total.
