## Bicentennial Ornaments Update

The stock of Bicentennial Ornaments has been rapidly depleted since the release of the second 2003 pair – *St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church* and *Shiloh Baptist Church* – in November. By the week before Christmas, no *St. Mary's* ornaments remained, the supply of the second shipment of the *Cragmoor Stone Church* was down to single digits, and both the *Napanoch Reformed Church* and *Shiloh Baptist* were selling well.

The *Town of Wawarsing Bicentennial Committee* decided in November that all ornaments would be limited in availability, complying with the advertised “limited edition” announcements. Two new ornaments will be available each spring and each fall... a total of sixteen houses of worship for the full set. Any reorders within the “limited edition” parameters will be placed at those times.

The *Bicentennial Ornament Project* is only one of the fundraising efforts planned by the *Town of Wawarsing Bicentennial Committee*. All funds will be used toward the expenses of the 2006 celebration of the two-hundredth anniversary of the township. Other historically-related projects will be announced in early 2004. 🌿
