Center Street and Areas South of Center Street
Monday Nov. 1st through Friday Nov. 5th

Areas North of Center Street
Monday Nov. 8th through Friday Nov. 12th

Residents are requested not to use bags. Items that will be picked up are leaves, yard waste, free limbs, and brush. Tree limbs and brush must be in lengths no larger than four-feet, tied in bundles, and in separate piles, or they will not be picked up.

Absolutely no car parts, building materials, paint cans, roofing materials, stones, rocks, drums of any size, tires, appliances, or the like will be picked up.

Upon arrival they found that a woman was suffering from anaphylactic shock, the results of an allergic reaction. Thankfully, the woman was able to point to the medicine chest where Officer Miller discovered an Epi-Pen, which she injected into the woman. When the *First Aid & Rescue* arrived, she was conscious and alert; without the swift action by Officer Miller, the woman may have died.

In recognition of her outstanding actions, Chief Matraccion presented Officer Miller with a plaque and commended her for a job well done.
